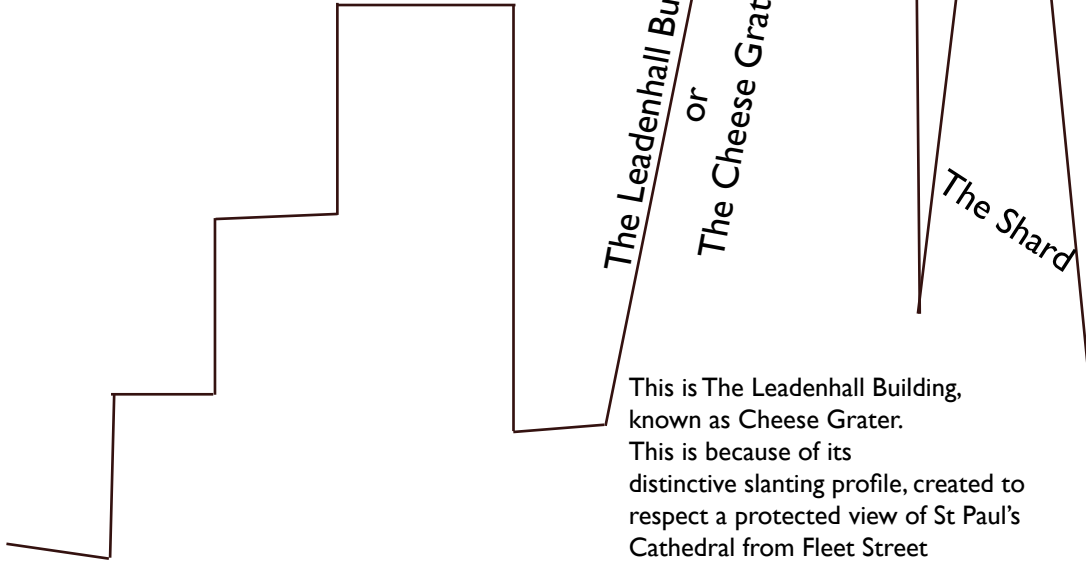

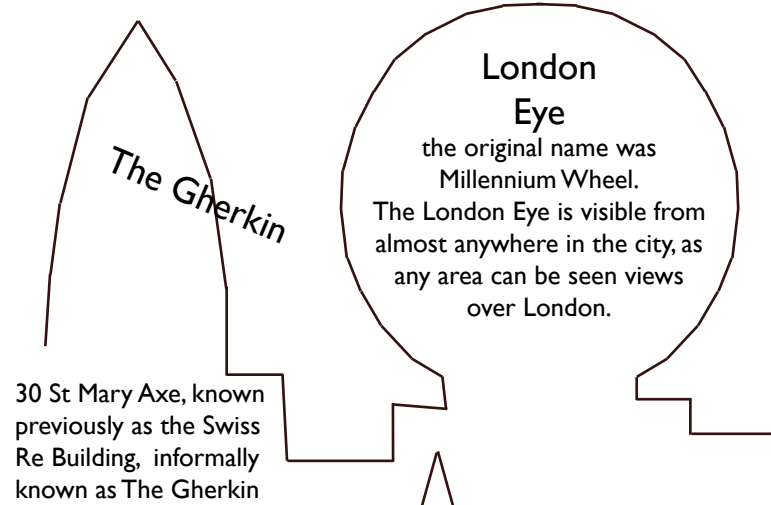

The Cheese Grater

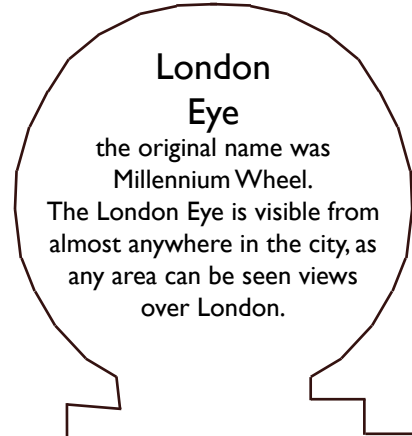
The Shard

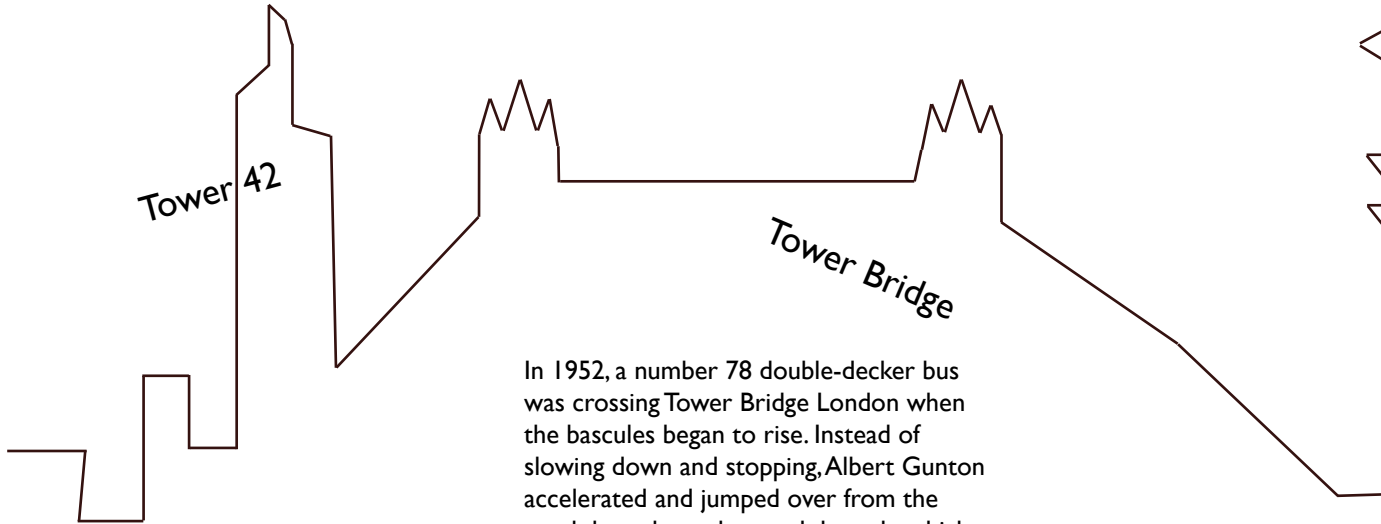
The Gherkin
